As a studio, we decided to continue this if we have contact information for someone deployed. All students are welcome to donate time, materials, and funds. Also, if anyone has a close family member also deployed, please contact Ms. Jennifer so we can send their units boxes as well. She is our coordinator for this effort.

The list may change with each box. The current list is:

- Microwavable popcorn
- Full sized toiletries: Floss, Deodorant, Soap, Toothpaste, Toothbrush
- Salt & pepper in shakers

- Ramen noodles
- Seasoning packets
- Junk food that won't melt or crush. For example--jelly beans, nuts, seeds, raisins, dried fruit, hard cookies, crunchy granola bars, hard candies.

Keep in mind there are restrictions when mailing overseas. It took three weeks for the first box to arrive. The goal is a box a month.

Respect and Obedience (Tenet 4)

What does it mean?

- Respect is thinking and acting in a positive way about yourself or others.
- Respect is thinking and acting in a way that shows others you care about their feelings and their well-being.
